From Manufacture d'Armes de Saint-Étienne to Cité du design...

Two centuries and a few good ideas later, the Manufacture Royale has regenerated as the Cité du design, where businesses and students at Saint-Étienne Higher School of Art and Design (ESASDSE, for short) rub shoulders. Horizontal, transparent, the La Platine building is conspicuous if nothing else. This odd box with its skin of scales covers a light-filled indoor street leading to exhibition rooms, workshop bubbles and a book and gift shop. La Platine is also home to the materials library, a library and an auditorium. Metal and glass meet stone and brick, as vestiges of the old Manufacture blend with modern construction. La Platine stretches out lengthways, while the Tour Observatoire stands proud and 31 metres tall, reaching for the sky and offering an unforgettable 360° view over the city and the surrounding hills. Out with the industrial wasteland, in with the new, the creative and the innovative: everything becomes possible with design!

Do we still need to introduce it?

Every two years (sometimes 3 when there's a good reason, such as a nasty epidemic that comes and upsets our plans), Saint-Étienne hosts the Biennale Internationale Design. An unmissable event on the design calendar, the one you know you absolutely have to experience! You'll cancel, postpone, drop anything, but you'll be there. A global reference in the world of design and creativity, the Biennale is Saint-Étienne as you have never seen it before. Designers, companies, artists and the curious pour in from all over the world to transform the city into a giant laboratory. Because you don't just come to admire, you come to think as well. You come to think about how design can help us to work better or come closer to other people. for example. Strange objects, different forms of artistic expression and points of view... it's amazing the good things design brings to the world

SEE YOU IN 2025 FOR THE 13TH BIENNALE INTERNATIONALE DESIGN SAINT-ÉTIENNE.



In 2025, design will have its own gallery in the city, the only one of its kind in France as the Galerie Nationale du Design opens its doors in the Cité du design. It will contain works from major national collections, and we have to say, we're impatient to see what it will be like.

If you are coming to the Cité du design with children, don't miss the Cabane du design. It's just opposite La Platine, and it's the BEST place to have some fun as a family. It's a space with fun workshops - free, no booking required - for children aged 5 and over, where they can be junior designers: creating things, trying them out, doing-undoing-redoing, setting challenges... Everything they need to learn what design is all about while having lots of fun!

Arms, ribbons and bikes

Put like that, it's hard to see the connection, which is fair enough. Come and visit the Musée d'Art et d'Industrie and you'll soon get it. When we say design is everywhere in Saint-Étienne, it's also because it's in the city's DNA. Saint-Étienne has always invented things. Firearms you probably know about, but also weaving looms, textiles and bikes. Yes, it was right here that the very first French bicycle was invented. So head down in the handlebars, and three collections later, you'll know all there is to know about Sainté. Or at least the links between its industrial past and its ambitions for the future will no longer hold any secrets for you.

After the Pompidou Centre, it's in Saint-Étienne that you will find one of the largest collections of contemporary art in France (20,000 works is something to write home about!)

A museum like this one deserves a bit of pampering! As it happens, in 2023, the MAMC+ is getting a makeover. It's done a great job for the last 35 years, valiantly hosting hundreds of exhibitions, thousands of picture hooks and display walls, not to mention over two million visitors. So now it's time for some well-earned rejuvenation treatment - it will be closed from 11 April. But not to worry, it will be reopening in spring 2024, and the staff have thought of everything, so in the meantime, there will be an exhibition of items from the museum's design collections at the Cité de design from June 2023 to January 2024. So put the reopening of the MAMC+ in your diary now. And a little bird has told us that a treasure long hidden from the public will be making its entrance...

A sculpture? A house? A flying saucer? A town within a town, now there's a good idea.

That was the idea of Le Corbusier, the visionary who needs no introduction. A stone's throw from Saint-Étienne, the Firminy-Vert site delights both connoisseurs and the curious: a multi-coloured Housing Unit, a rather odd, cone-shaped church, a concave Cultural Centre, a stadium in the form of an amphitheatre and a swimming pool. You wanted Le Corbusier? Well, here you have it, lots of it. It's great to look at and on top of that, there are some cracking anecdotes. Did you know that this site was his second largest complex in the world? And that the windows of the Maison de la Culture were musical windows? And guess which constellation appears in the concrete of Saint-Pierre's church? Anyway, the best thing is to go there, see for yourself and get a little lesson in creativity.

Designers imagine, we test - in real life in Saint-Étienne. Original objects designed by local designers and companies are dotted all over town. See the "Éclosia" on Place Fourneyron, the "Cubes Gigogne" (nesting cubes) on Place Chavanelle, the "LLPGM" otherwise known as the "smallest terraces in the world" in front of La Comète. Oh and don't miss the latest arrival: "En route pour l'aventure..." on Square Schoelcher. An intriguing one... The cityscape is becoming a new playground and a place for walkers, with designer creations nestled everywhere. Here are just 2 or 3 to give you a flavour of things: a series of little yellow seats dotted along the boulevard opposite the station, a belvedere walk sweetly named the "Garden of Possibilities. a walk along the edge of the earth", and also cool shops that play the design game and challenge each other in a competition... That's what design is all about in Saint-Étienne - it's innovative, creative, full of surprises and it brings people together!

In the Saint-Étienne lingo, "agaa", a "gandot" is a mess tin that the miners used to take their lunch to work. And these days, the word is still used for any lunch box used to take your own food with you.

To see Sainté's origins, no need for the Tardis (sorry Doctor!).

In the oldest part of Sainté there's a little treasure not far from the impressive Grand'Éalise. This is the Demeure Chamoncel, Maison du Patrimoine et des Lettres (the name says it all: the "house of heritage and letters"). Half-timbering, mullioned windows, stone carvings: you get the picture, the original photogenic building! Of course this 16th century house, which belonged to a brilliant merchant, named - you guessed it - Chamoncel, is a listed Historic Monument. Inside, it's the ultimate time-travel experience: vaulted passages, spiral staircases... It's almost like you were there, and in fact you do get to meet some characters from the time, who have some stories to tell about Sainté (with the help of some augmented reality). A trip back in time focused on literary works. There are even story-telling sessions and workshops to complete the experience. Our tip? Visit with a Ville d'Art & d'Histoire guide to discover all the building's secrets.

Who would think that the building was on the point of falling down in the 1990s? Quite a turnaround then, since now it's receiving visitors!

Walls, doors, window frames, beams... everything has been restored to preserve the spirit of the 16th century architecture.

And that's precisely why the restoration was honoured with a Departmental prize at the end of 2022, the "Ruban du Patrimoine" (Heritage Ribbon) awarded by the French Building Federation, the FFB. Refreshing!

Interested in a Do-It-Yourself science experience? Head for Explora.

No boring science lessons here, just experiments for budding scientists of all ages: observe, think of something to try, then try it! Don't expect perfect results: it's by making mistakes in the lab that you gain experience. Do it the way engineers do! And in fact it's La Rotonde, the Cultural, Scientific, Technical and Industrial Centre at the École des Mines engineering school in Saint-Étienne that is behind this educational lab. Whether your aim is to launch a rocket, make a light card, programme a space root, design an electronic instrument, like Einstein, we use recovered materials and our creative intelligence.

The garden next door to Explora is no ordinary garden. Four plots make up the "Research Garden". Intriguing...

Designed and monitored by researchers and students from Saint-Étienne, these are plots that are used to study the role plants can play in decontaminating polluted soil and how insect pollinators frequent different plants.

If you're interested in graffiti art, you should have a wander around Sainté, Roche-la-Molière and Saint-Chamond.

Thanks to the region's industrial past, local graffiti artists and co. have plenty of scope to express themselves. When it's not an abandoned factory providing them with a canvas, it's a local festival, the SAFIR in Roche-la-Molière. Sometimes, the city actually provides the wall. The M.U.R. Saint-Étienne is a giant art wall installed right in the street (rue du Frère Maras, to be precise), which invites a different guest artist to fill the space every month. That's how we are in Saint-Étienne, we like big art. Very big even. Ella & Pitr, does that ring a bell? Their giant works, often ephemeral and anamorphic, can only be admired if you stand well back. You see, more locals inviting you to change your point of view...

At some 15 metres high, you can hardly miss it! What exactly are we talking about? The face of a woman lost in thought painted on the wall of the Hotel Kyriad in Rue de la Montat. Another beautiful work by the artist Viza. Like this woman who invites us to look afresh at this fast changing part of the city, take the time to look around and appreciate what you see.





Even if you don't like football, you will have heard of it. Everybody knows the ASSE, the mythical Saint-Étienne football club.

The Greens had their own museum before everyone else. And not long ago they even opened a brasserie inside the stadium! Panoramic view of the pitch, modern decoration, the perfect setting to enjoy the cuisine rooted in local values. In short, the Cauldron, Aimé Jacquet, Platini ... we all know them. But the ASSE is like the city of Saint-Étienne: out of the ordinary, creative and innovative. And not everybody knows that. One of the old logos that was originally designed in the 60s by a Fine Arts student, an interplanetary hit pop song sung by a former player - "Je te survivrai, d'un amour vivant... " - an immersive display with halfsphere projection to relive a game as if you were there, 2,600 m² of solar panels on the stadium roof... So, as the chant goes, "Who's the best? The Greens, of course".

The ASSE is also committed to helping the local community, which it does through its association, ASSE Cœur Vert. The values it focuses on are health, citizenship, sport for all and the environment. One of its good ideas was to set up a wheelchair football section, ASSE Cœur-Vert Aésio, in 2016, and the team now plays in division 1. The pride the players feel when they slip on that jersey spurs them on, and they give 200% to defend their team's colours.

A conical hat, an acute accent, a smile...

People often compare it to a temple, but if you think the roof of the Opéra de Saint-Étienne looks like a boat, no problem. The people of Saint-Étienne have imagination - they won't mind. Each season the curtain rises on over 150 performances of opera (its speciality), music or dance. How many opera houses that produce their own shows, sets and costumes do you know? Perched on one of Saint-Étienne's seven hills, the Opéra does not look down on anyone. On the contrary, it likes to share its enthusiasm. It organises activities for children and musicology conferences with the University of Saint-Étienne. So line up in twos, it's show time!

Every aspect of the architecture is a tribute to Saint-Étienne design: the metallic exterior, the looms, and the front of the bar that looks like a red ribbon. Come on, show a bit of imagination!



BE LIKE A STÉPHANOIS

Whether you are preparing to come or you're already here, we've drawn up THE checklist of 10 things you need to know or do to live like a real Stéphanois.

1/ Get a tram ticket straight away and ride the full length of the 7 km long Grand'Rue.

This is no ordinary street. it runs north to south, from Bellevue to La Terrasse.

2/ Take the high road and see THE panoramic view over the west of Saint-Étienne.

That means up the Crêt de Roc hill and its famous steps to reach our very own little Montmartre... it's quite a climb, mind you!

3/ Head for Rue des Martvrs de Vingré for a drink at a pavement café.

Day and night, there's always something going on in this part of town. There's a village feel about it, you can enjoy strolling along streets lined with shops. bars and little restaurants. When the sun comes out. so do the pavement tables so you can enjoy the fine historic façades along with your drink.



4/ Start to learn the essential Gaga expressions.

We can confirm it, you'll soon be lost listening to the locals talking to each other. Fouilla, bichette, se mettre en caisse, débarouler. probably won't mean much to you even if you speak French. Which is not surprising as it's Gaga. There are lots of local dialect words still in use here. So get yourself a dictionary of the expressions and you'll soon be able to show off what you've learnt.

5/ Change your playlist.

Listen to musicians and singers from Saint-Étienne: Cœur. La Belle Vie. Dub inc, Bernard Lavilliers or the group Terrenoire, who have already won a Victoire de la Musique (the French Grammies)!

6/ Try a good râpée with a sarasson.

Whether it's at home or with friends don't forget to try this essential part of local cuisine. It's grated potato cakes with a cheese preparation. We know, your mouth's watering already.

7/ As soon as the sun comes out, head for Le Pilat for a good walk.

A walk at the Gouffre d'Enfer dam just 10 minutes out of Saint-Étienne is every local's favourite Sunday walk. Greenery and wide open spaces within a stone's throw of the city. We promise you'll love it too.

8/ Run for the beach.

Yes, you heard right, we even have a beach! Take an early morning dip and enjoy all the water sports and activities all through the day, finishing up with a picnic at the Plateau de la Danse. So romantic....

9/ Take part in the Sainte-Barbe celebrations.

On the first weekend in December we celebrate our past! There are things happening in all the city neighbourhoods, all focused on the patron saint of miners, St. Barbara. The day always ends with the traditional torchlit procession through the city followed by a firework display from the headframe at the old Puits Couriot mine.

10/ Buy a chunk of Fourme de Montbrison cheese (made by our neighbours in Montbrison) and think of an original way to eat it.

Try it in a gratin, in croquettes, salads, tarts, fondues, even ice cream! In Loire, this blue cheese pops up just about everywhere, from the aperitif to the dessert, literally! Our best advice is to choose a large portion.

Can you imagine? An entire district of the city dedicated to great ideas and innovation. The creative district. otherwise known as Manufacture Plaine-Achille, is a town within a town.

No more guns. Now the aisles of the old Manufacture are full of people cheerfully working side by side and sharing their curiosity. Artists, the media, students, startuppers, researchers... There's room for everyone on the 20-hectare site, and even more so now that the Centre des Savoirs pour l'Innovation - a centre for knowledge and innovation designed to foster exchanges between academics and companies - has opened. This new eco-district fully intends to give the city's economy a boost. You can pool your grey matter and share tips in the co-working spaces, you can rack your brains and work up an appetite ready for a zero-waste meal at La FABuleuse cantine. And what about rounding off the day with a guick visit to an exhibition? There's always something worth seeing, as you'd

expect in any third place worth its salt.

And the transformation has onlu just beaun. Bu 2025, the Creative District will boast even more exhibitions a hotel, several restaurants, a concept store, bars and an entrepreneurship centre. And to top it all off, there will

It's beautiful because it's proof that the neighbourhood has completely reinvented itself. As soon as you come out onto the station forecourt. you need to open your eyes wide. Design stools, blue horse sculptures, a multi-coloured tree... it is home to loads of design projects. The new Chateaucreux is as much about business as it is about contemporary architecture. Casino has based its worldwide headquarters here and on the Îlot Grüner, the Cité Administrative will blow you over with its lemon yellow façades. Three huge, staggered porches enable you to admire the building from every angle. Just next door, the social security offices have seen red and dressed themselves in cassettes of aluminium. With all these structures, you could almost forget that this is also a neighbourhood where people live: surprisingly the built space here includes as much housing as it does office space! A vision, a wealth of ideas and colour aplenty have certainly shaken things up around here.



Completed in spring 2023. the Tour Tésé is the business district's latest tower block. Built of alass steel and wood discreetly concealed in its facade there are over 1000 m² of solar panels. Amazinaly, it produces more energy than it uses. It's even been designed so that the offices can be converted in homes and vice versa Clever!

up, is a sort of workshop, but more modern. A place where people come to exchange ideas and take advantage of the latest generation of equipment to innovate, create, make prototypes. And OpenFactory is the local name for the Saint-Étienne FabLab. Has everybody followed that? As its name suggests, we are open to all at the OpenFactory: students, entrepreneurs, people looking to retrain, pensioners, in short all those who want to understand and try out digital manufacturing, in a friendly, good-humoured setting. But what exactly can you do with a digital milling machine or a laser cutting machine? Go and find out for yourself - we've in favour of DIY here!



In Sainté, everu second Saturday in the month from 9 am to 12, at 1 rue Jean Réchatin (next to the Cité du design), people can bring in their broken appliances and see if our experienced volunteers can bring them back to life! Add coffee and conviviality to the mix and you've got a Repair'Café.



This is the story of a neighbourhood that is in the process of reinventing itself.

Crêt de Roc might have a strange name, but what it also has in abundance is ideas. Perched up there on its hill, the neighbourhood has undergone a genuine eco-sustainable transformation, but without looking down on anybody – quite the contrary. Sustainable housing, social ties, a youth hostel. alternative modes of consumption, respect for biodiversity... Its famous steps now attract artists, entrepreneurs and associations. In fact it's thanks to them that this is a place on the move: Rues du Développement Durable (Sustainable Development Streets) for example, which is strongly committed to the social and solidarity economy. It organises "thinkshops" with local residents, puts life back into empty premises and even offers solidarity offices. Carton Plein is another association that has turned an old cardboard factory into a pop-up artistic venue open to all. And what can you say about the initiatives of the Centre International de Séjour Clairvivre-Wogenscky, the young people's hostel that sits up at the top of the hill and whose architecture can't help but remind you of a certain Le Corbusier... Hurry up and visit, the ideas just keep coming.



As well as providina accommodation and a canteen, the CIS Clairvivre-Woaenscku uouna workers' hostel also offers cookery workshops using locallu produced ingredients sometimes very local produce, straight from the communal vegetable garden and beehives on the roof! In fact the centre's whole ethos is very ecology-focused - the accommodation has been awarded the European Ecolabel and is affiliated to the Éthic Étapes network.

THE CREATORS' TRAIL

On the shelves: jewellery, scarves, bags, posters and craft-printed postcards, mostly made with second-hand materials. If you want to try your hand at making things, a number of workshops are scheduled over the year. But above all this is a place for sharing, where you can come along and chat with the craftswomen.

A new craftswoman has opened a workshop and shop in one of the pedestrianised streets in Saint-Étienne. 11 rue Louis Merley - Saint-Étienne

Clémence Chaize makes gold-plated or silver jewellery engraved with bees, her favourite animal. In this light-filled shop decorated with old furniture (which she does up herself), you can also find decorative items, wooden board games and hand-made clothes. So much to discover.





Spotlight on La Poudrière, a little shop in the Saint-Jacques neighbourhood, where you can find fashion accessories, decorative items, jewellery, cosmetics - all made by 8 "fireballs" of craftswomen (hence the name of the shop, which means 'powder keg').

They all have one thing in common: the desire to preserve the environment, use local or second-hand and/or organic products.

Don't visit, live the past!

That's exactly what the Adventure of the Train proposes: it's an immersive digital trail that transports you - in a wagon, if you please - back to the industrial revolution, to meet the pioneers of the railways. You might not know it, but the first railway line in continental Europe was built between Saint-Étienne and Andrézieux in 1827. An amazing innovation at the time, driven by the need to transport the local coal to France's cities more easily (the coal was then transferred onto *rambertes*, large barges that plied the Loire - you can see one at Château de Bouthéon).

Such a revolutionary development certainly deserved its own visitor centre. So all aboard, this is where the Adventure of the Train begins.

Back to 1827. Originally,
44 horses each towed 8 tonnes
of coal divided between 4 carts
over a 17-kilometre single-lane

Whether by bike or in your trainers on Shanks' pony, come and enjoy a ramble among the old stones of the medieval castle of Rochetaillée. At the Gouffre d'Enfer (the Abyss of Hell), one of the many dams in the area, you can join the locals on their favourite walk. But don't worry, there's nothing hellish about it, on the contrary it's a real paradise for Sunday outings!

Ever heard of the Giant Fir Tree of Tarentaise in the Grand Bois forest near the Souvignet bridge over the Furan?

Here are some figures that to make your head spin: the tree is over 200 years old (planted in the 17th century) and it's situated at an altitude of 1051 metres. It's 43.4 metres high (the height of a 17-storey building) and has a circumference of no less than 4.32 metres. It blows you away, doesn't it?

The Loire, deciduous forests, castles, islands, steep cliffs.

Guess where you are? In the Loire Gorges Nature Reserve, well done! 4,000 hectares of pure nature, 355 of which are in the Regional Nature Park fresh air in abundance. And it isn't just oaks that have popped up along the river banks – there are castles too. Essalois stands proud up on its rock, but actually it's a cool one to visit. It's open to the public, for free. On the other side, there's Grangent. All alone on its island, it's hard to imagine it used to be perched at a height of 60 metres... Before the dam was built, the valley looked quite different. At Saint-Victor, they lost a railway line, but gained a water sports centre. And with it a beach, a marina, boat trips and some fantastic angling, all within throwing distance of the city centre... And who do we thank then?

There's one boat that's different to the others at the Saint-Victor-sur-Loire water sports centre. At the helm, not Marie-Jeanne, but Serge Truphème who works for the SMAGL, the Loire Gorges development authority.

This is one of the most beautiful villages in France (official: on the Plus Beaux Villages de France list!), and probably the one with the most nerve!

Sainte-Croix-en-Jarez is a village with a bit of a cheek, squatting as it does in a 14th century monastery. Two large squares, a church and some underground passages: the scene is set. A no-frills sort of village, kind of lost in Le Pilat, A place where people came for peace and quiet. And yet, no more silence and austerity: "The world turns, but the cross remains" was the motto of the monks before the Revolution and they got it just right. The cross is still here, but the rest has certainly changed. No more silence and austerity. Today it's drinks with the neighbours, kids playing offground tag and visitors are welcome. La Chartreuse has adapted, as you can see, and especially to accommodate our connected teens: it now offers them an "interactive quest" they can pursue armed with their tablets in the old monastery. So you know what you have to do now...




Quick geography lesson: the Gier is a river that has its source in the heights of Le Pilat, at La Jasserie to be precise.

After tumbling 900 metres over a magnificent stretch of just 12 kilometres, it disappears underground near Saint-Chamond and then continues its course gently to finish up at Givors. Anyway, over its 44 kilometres, the Gier and its valley hold some good surprises. Little villages, big nature, heritage, engineering... there's plenty to do and see. So how about coming to see how the river powered 700 weaving looms in one textile mill, at the Maison des Tresses et Lacets? Or perhaps you would prefer to study the foundations of the Roman aqueduct? Or maybe the Rocher Percé at Tartaras? And why not go and step into a blacksmith's shoes at La Mourine in Saint-Martin-la-Plaine? However you decide to spend your day, by the end of it, you'll appreciate a little glass of red wine - a Coteaux du Gier, of course, to be drunk responsibly, as usual.

In this valley historically awhirr with textile looms a new third place called "La Turbine Créative" has recentlu opened in Doizieux. There you can meet craftspeople working in textiles and related sectors, and above all uou can sign up for courses offering an introduction to plantbased dyes, felting, Sashikon embroidery or hand weaving. And for the most intrepid among you, a textiles fablab provides the opportunity to experiment, make prototypes and produce almost like a professional!





What can you do with a derelict industrial site? A new neighbourhood with a bright future, of course!

In Saint-Chamond, they've sent the war machines off to be made somewhere else and converted the old factory into a giant leisure area. Novaciéries, as it's called, covers a 45-hectare site. It's a sustainable neighbourhood, a landscaped park and an eco-industrial site, all at once. Homes, shops, leisure park... this new eco-responsible neighbourhood has something to keep everyone happy. A little bit of shopping, cycle tracks and a skatepark over here, connected spaces over there, an open-air stage, a cinema over there, and even a water garden supplied by rainwater. And, because we like to do things right, the site not only qualifies for the national "EcoQuartier" label, it also won first prize in the Lumières® 2020 competition. Hats off to Saint-Chamond!





There's definitely a wow effect when you first see Avenue de la Libération with its buildings each more intriguing than the last. And especially the famous Hôtel des Ingénieurs, a listed Historic Monument if you please, fresh from a recent facelift. The fruit of a collaboration between architects Clermont and Teisseire, your eyes will be drawn upward to the sculptures by Paul Henri Graf illustrating Saint-Étienne's traditional industries: on the high-reliefs, no doubt about it, it's Mining and Metallurgy that are celebrated.



A new spot for the *mâtrus* (that's kids in Gaga)! Villebœuf stadium has had a makeover. It has taken on board the notion of "active design" to get people spontaneously involved in sport. What else would you expect from France's only UNESCO Creative City of Design?





On Cours Fauriel, enter La Soucoupe! Here's a place where it's all about curiosity: asking questions, searching, testing, discovering, exchanging, marvelling and having fun. The experiments are conducted by La Rotonde, the cultural, scientific, technical and industrial centre at the École des Mines engineering school in Saint-Étienne. And just a few metres away (still on Cours Fauriel), located on the former Manufrance site since 1993, the Planétarium - topped with its strange dome - shares all the little secrets of Space.

Welcome into another world, that of the manager, an ardent chess fan - hence the name Dame d4 Café ("dame" being the queen in the chess set). Bar, restaurant, arts centre and music venue. The place is buzzing all year round! There's so much to do that you could easily forget to have a bite to eat, whereas the generous proportions and local cuisine are really not to be missed. And of course, while you're enjoying a drink and between two games of chess you can get up for a bop!

Our "Daphne changed into laurels" sculpted by Jules Dercheu has seen some adventures in her time! We lost the bronze statue in 1942 along with many others. But in 2022 it became possible to make a copy, thanks to the Fonderie Rosini in Paris. Awesome! And so today she's back - in the only ornamental pond on Place Jean-Jaurès.





And 1, 2, 3, pull. Yes, what you're sitting on is an Active Bench. This one is called IPitup and it's brought to you direct from Belgium by Playgones. A perfect example of the great ideas that comes out of the Banc d'essai (Test Bench) urban design project.



2006, Saint-Étienne. 3 men with a lot in common had an idea: to create an art gallery to promote artists, particularly those in the Supports/Surfaces movement. You have to give it to them, they know about art: starting with Bernard Ceysson, former director of the MAMC+, who joined forces with François Ceysson and Loïc Bénétière. A success? We should say! Luxembourg, Paris, Geneva, New-York, Lyon, the little *Stéphanoise* is playing with the big kids. So in Sainté too, things are expanding: 1000 m² of space for unique exhibitions right in the heart of the Creative District.



See that futuristic-looking building in the middle of the Creative District? Well, that's our Zénith. And it's not the work of any old architect. Designed by Sir Norman Foster in person. The architect of the City Hall building in London has left his highly original mark on Saint-Étienne with this concert arena. On the eco-responsibility front, the Zénith also boasts a number of advantages: ventilation and cooling using the prevailing winds, natural thermal regulation, etc. In short, a building for its times.







Ready to create ties between past and present? If so, head for the Maison du Passementier and see how the workers lived in the 50s. You'll find numerous interesting objects and furniture from the early 20th century. A wave of nostalgia will come over you as soon as you step into the kitchen. A photo in front of the stove maybe?

Shame, but why not try the loop around Sainté? At Saint-Jean-Bonnefonds, it's the ribbon maker you have to call in on. More particularly his house, which is a museum/workshop that tells with passion the tale of this trade that marked the village between the 17th and 20th centuries. In Sorbiers, a short bucolic walk is organised in the Parc de Valjoly. Terrenoire is a group from Saint-Étienne that is making guite a name for itself, but it's also the name of a neighbourhood of Sainté that you really shouldn't miss. Above all, a trip to the Château de la Perrotière is a must. It has a park that is well worth a wander on a nice day. At L'Étrat, you might be lucky enough to meet one of the green angels of Saint-Étienne football club coming out of the official training centre. So get your jersey on, buckle up and get going.



Would you like to know what the future looks like? Well, it's at Saint-Chamond that it's happening!

The most telling example is the Novaciéries neighbourhood. This derelict industrial site has certainly changed, you can see that. Converted into an immense leisure area, with its brand new Véo Grand Lumière cinema, its restaurants, its shops and skatepark, the great hall has become the new favourite icon of the Couramiauds ("chasers of cats") - that's another name for Saint-Chamond's inhabitants, which came about because it was said that they spent their time chasing after cats. Who knows exactly why... But in Saint-Cham', you can also find some impressive architectural symbols. You can visit the old Hôtel-Dieu, the churches of Saint-Pierre, Saint-Ennemond and Notre Dame or the Hôtel de Ville and its inner courtyard overlooking Nelson Mandela park. The town dear to Antoine Pinay and Alain Prost is constantly changing. Be warned, in Saint-Chamond they live life to the full.

FORGING A RACTER In the Loire, you could say we've case-hardened our character. To see what we mean, just come to the Gier valley and the foothills of the Jarez. The Rocher Percé site in Tartaras is a jewel in our heritage crown with its basin and double lock. Just imagine: 166 metres of rock dug out

The first stop will be La Mourine at Saint-Martinla-Plaine. Here they forged a history that burned as bright as the blacksmith's brazier. Between air, water, coal and iron, this interpretation centre will set you alight. A visit off the beaten track, in a place that is a sheer concentrate of local history and ancestral know-how. If you push on a little further, you might be surprised by your next encounter. In Saint-Martin-la-Plaine, we also have gorillas! Amazing as that may seem, this is actually a worldrenowned conservation centre for the great apes. At the zoo, founded in 1972 by Pierre and Eliane Thivillon, the animals are treated divinely. Go and have a look and say hello to the chimpanzees, ring-tailed lemurs, snow leopards and other animals. The region is also a haven of peace and tranquillity, with endless possibilities for stretching your legs a bit. There's no need to go far! Over in the villages of Dargoire, Tartaras or Chagnon for example, where the footpaths will take to you to discover the Cave du Curé, the Rocher Percé or the Saint-Joseph hill.

Jarez is the only one in France. So, in the Jarez region, you will need to climb up high to see this unusual site. We are a long way from monastic austerity, though. Here, they welcome the inquisitive of all kinds, for creative visits with a variety of activities and events. With a series of festivals, exhibitions, orienteering courses, games throughout the year, There's plenty to do at La Chartreuse de Sainte-Croix-en-Jarez. If your thing is walks and big rocks, we've got just what you need: a great one-hour walk out to the Roches de Marlin megalithic site. But the Jarez region also has another trick up its sleeve over in La Terrasse-sur-Dorlay. The town is home to one of the most unusual museums in the Department of Loire: the Maison des Tresses et Lacets. This magical place is taking care to preserve the know-how of an entire region that made a huge contribution to fashion until the middle of the 20th century with its braiding machines. So tie your laces and set off for the Jarez, a region full of surprises!



What about a trip back in time to the Maison des Tresses et Lacets?

On its outdoor trail, see the water power system that drive the weaving looms back in the day: mill races, sluice gates, retention ponds, water wheels it could power no less than 600 looms!



They form dams: the Gouffre d'Enfer, 53 metres high, the Pas du Riot, 31.5 metres high, Le Piney, 45 metres high with a giant painted on the wall. A clash of titans, but above all an invitation to overcome vertigo. From the village of Rochetaillée, dominated by its "decapitated" feudal castle, it's easy to set off on walks to the arched giants. And if your legs want more? Since we're in the Le Pilat Regional Nature Park, all you need is good map, your walking shoes and off you go, out into the open spaces. And the amazing thing is this incredible change of scenery is within just a few minutes of Sainté city centre! If you are less down-to-earth and you would like to learn more about the constellations, just in case you need it for long romantic evenings, we also have what you need. The Luzernod observatory at La Valla-en-Gier, organises a dozen evenings a year when you can escape into the stars. And once you are in La Valla, it would be a shame not to pop and see Le Saut du Gier, a lovely waterfall just above the village. Just be careful not to get wet!

But there's nothing to stop you going and placing a coin or two on Yellow Cassock or Polka Dot Pink. Unless your weakness is for the one-armed bandit or the roulette wheel, in which case the Casino Le Lion Blanc is where it's at. For a taste of a life of luxury, no need to win the jackpot either - you can simply take a trip to the Château de Bouthéon. Here, the medieval rubs shoulders with the Renaissance. and the owners' ghosts are here to welcome you. The 36 species of fish in the Loire aquarium are happy blowing bubbles, while their neighbours the hens, goats and draft horses while away the time in 11 hectares of grounds. If you want to continue your journey through time, hop on board to relive the trip from Saint-Étienne and Andrézieux in the 19th century. Open your eyes wide for an immersive digital performance-tour on the Aventure du Train. To round off your trip, make sure you don't miss the stunning view of the plain from the little village of Saint-Bonnet-les-Oules, which is also famous for its many potters who used to make earthenware pots known as "oules". A "superoule" view, you might say!


Have you got restless legs, a hankering to get out walking?
