

From Manufacture d'Armes de Saint-Étienne to Cité du design...

Two centuries and a few good ideas later, the Manufacture Royale has regenerated into a creative district offering a rich variety of cultural venues and events, where businesses, visitors, tourists and students of Art and Design (ESADSE, for short) all rub shoulders. Horizontal, translucent, the La Platine building certainly stands out. This odd box with its skin of scales covers a light-filled indoor street leading to **exhibitions**, visitor experience spaces and the Cité du design's book and gift shop. La Platine is also home to a library and a materials library. Opposite La Platine, the Cabane du Design offers young children the chance to get into the skin of a designer. In this area currently undergoing a major transformation, metal and glass meet stone and brick, as vestiges of the old Manufacture blend with modern architecture. La Platine stretches out lengthways, while the Tour Observatoire stands proud and 31 metres tall, reaching for the sky and offering an unforgettable 360° view over the city and the surrounding hills. Out with the industrial wasteland, in with the new, the creative and the innovative!

2025, as well as being a "Biennale year", will see design gain its own gallery in the city, the only one of its kind in France as the Galerie Nationale du Design opens its doors in the Cité du design. It will contain works from major national collections, and we have to say, we're impatient to see what it will be like.

After the Centre Pompidou, it's in Saint-Étienne that you will find one of the largest collections of contemporary art in France.

A museum like this one deserves a bit of pampering! In 2023-2024, the MAMC+ has been reinventing itself to offer its visitors a new experience. For the last 35 years, it has valiantly hosted hundreds of exhibitions, thousands of picture hooks and display walls, not to mention over two million visitors. So now it's time for some well-earned rejuvenation treatment!

It's all been taken care of: from now **until the museum reopens in autumn 2024**, the museum is running a project off its own premises called "**Sept merveilles du MAMC+**": From February to August 2024 seven municipalities in the Métropole are each in turn hosting a work from the MAMC+ collection. 7 works, 7 municipalities, 7 months... A perfect opportunity to plan a series of outings to see the works from MAMC+ and discover the Métropole area at the same time.

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We've already noted the reopening of the MAMC+ in the autumn in our diaries. Put like that, it's hard to see the connection, which is fair enough. Come and visit the Musée d'Art et d'Industrie and you'll soon get it. When we say design is everywhere in Saint-Étienne, it's also because it's in the city's DNA. Saint-Étienne has always invented and made things. Firearms you probably know about, but also weaving looms, textiles and bikes. Yes, it was right here that the very first French bicycle, the Hirondelle, was invented. Tempted to try something new? Come and see the museum's new permanent exhibition. La mécanique de *l'art*: covering more than 900 sqm of exhibition space and with a newly revamped scenography where you can hear, touch and activate the objects, art resumes its rightful place alongside industry. Definitely something to try, alone, with friends or with the family!

When it first opened 160 years ago, it was called the "Palais des Arts"! It housed the municipal library and the art school, our famous École des Beaux-Arts! After several name changes, since 2006 the latter art school has been known as the Saint-Étienne Higher School of Art and Design (École Supérieure d'Art et de Design de Saint-Étienne or ESADSE for short) and has moved into buildings at the heart of the Cité du design.

Welcome to recreational design's laboratory city...

Designers imagine, we test - in real life in Saint-Étienne. Original objects, designed by local designers and companies are dotted all over town. See the "Éclosia" on Place Fourneyron, the "Cubes Gigogne" (nesting cubes) on Place Chavanelle, the "LLPGM" otherwise known as the "smallest terraces in the world" in front of La Comète. Or "Tribune" on Place Jean Jaurès - intriguing. don't you think? The cityscape is becoming a new playground and a place for walkers, with designer creations nestled everywhere. Here are just 2 or 3 to give you a flavour of things: a series of little yellow seats dotted along the boulevard opposite the station, a belvedere walk sweetly named the "Garden of Possibilities, a walk along the edge of the earth", and also cool shops that play the design game and challenge each other in a competition... That's what design is all about in Saint-Étienne - it's innovative, creative, full of surprises and it brings people together!

"La Voque" - have you heard that word before? It's what we call the funfair in the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes reaion. Desianer Jean Couvreur wanted to give a little nod to the funfair by using this name for his street chairs, designed to look a bit like fairground bumper cars. Installed on Place de l'Hôtel de Ville for the Biennale du Design 2022, they can now be seen again on Place Louis Comte. The square has had a facelift and certainly deserved some fine-looking seats to finish the job. Several seats are arranged around the space to reproduce the effect of the fairground attraction.



If you think mining is something to do with big data, it is time to have a day out at the Puits Couriot.

Before, it was here that miners went underground to dig coal. The site is now a listed Historic Monument and there's more fun to be had than in the old days. The museum tells the story of Saint-Étienne's adventure with coal. The museum pitches you right into the history of the mine with its display rooms and even offers a short trip underground. It shakes you up in every sense of the word. Outside, though, change of atmosphere: when summer comes, it's time to open the "quinquette". It gets off to a gentle start with a game of petangue and a local beer, then everyone takes to a deckchair to watch the concerts and other entertainments. Just opposite, all this agitation does not stop the slag heaps from continuing to slowly consume themselves.

Create something, get it wrong, start again... that's how we like to do things in Saint-Étienne. Just as well! For its temporary exhibition "Mini-mine", which runs from April to November 2024, the Musée de la Mine has opted for a LEGO model. It is designed to be completely reusable once the exhibition is over. Clever, eh?

To see Sainté's origins, no need for the Tardis (sorry Doctor!).

In the **oldest part of Sainté**, there's a little treasure, not far from the impressive Grand'Éalise. This is the Demeure Chamoncel, Maison du Patrimoine et des Lettres (the name says it all: the "house of heritage and letters"). Half-timbering, mullioned windows, stone carvings: the original photogenic building! Of course this 16th century house, which belonged to a brilliant merchant, named - you quessed it - Chamoncel, is a listed Historic Monument. Inside, it's the ultimate time-travel experience: vaulted passage, spiral staircase... It's almost like you were there, and in fact you do get to meet some characters from the time, who have some stories to tell about Sainté (with the help of some augmented reality). A trip back in time focused on literary works. There are even workshops to complete the immersion. Our tip? Visit with a Ville d'Art & d'Histoire guide to discover all the building's secrets.

Interested in a Do-It-Yourself science experience? Head for Explora.

No boring science lessons here, just experiments for budding scientists of all ages*: observe, think of something to try, then try it! Don't expect perfect results: it's by making mistakes in the lab that you gain experience. Do it the way engineers do! And in fact it's La Rotonde, the Cultural, Scientific, Technical and Industrial Centre at the École des Mines engineering school in Saint-Étienne that is behind this educational lab. Whether your aim is to launch a rocket, make a light card, programme a space root, design an electronic instrument, like Einstein, we use recovered materials and our creative intelligence.

Even if you don't like football, you will have heard of it (thank you Timothée Chalamet!) Everybody knows the ASSE, the mythical Saint-Étienne football club.

True to their pioneering spirit, the Greens had their own museum before anyone else! Hundreds of objects on display in 800 m² of space divided into 11 themed areas take you right back to the glory days and the club's most unforgettable moments. Not long ago they even opened a **brasserie** inside the stadium! Panoramic view of the pitch, modern decoration, the perfect place for a relaxing break. In short, the Cauldron, Aimé Jacquet, Platini... we're familiar with all of them. But the ASSE is like the city of Saint-Étienne: out of the ordinary, creative and innovative. And not everybody knows that. One of the old logos that was originally designed in the 60s by a Fine Arts student, an interplanetary hit pop song sung by a former player - "Je te survivrai, d'un amour vivant..." - an immersive display with half-sphere projection to relive a game as if you were there, 2,600 sqm of solar panels on the stadium roof... So, as the chant aces. "Who's the best? The Greens, of course".

A conical hat, an acute accent, a smile...

People often compare it to a temple, but if you think the roof of the **Opéra de Saint-Étienne** looks like a boat, no problem. The people of Saint-Étienne have imagination, they won't mind. Each season **the curtain rises on over 150 performances of opera** (its speciality), **music or dance**. How many opera houses that **produce their own shows, sets and costumes do you know?** Perched on one of Saint-Étienne's seven hills, the Opéra doesn't look down on anyone. On the contrary, it likes to share its enthusiasm. It organises activities to introduce children to the opera and musicology conferences with the University of Saint-Étienne. So line up in twos, it's show time!

Would you like to get to know all the ins and outs of the Opéra? Well, now uou can! Several times a year, the Opéra oraanises visits it calls "Côté scène - Côté coulisses" (Onstage - Backstage). On these occasions, it throws open the doors to its set construction and costume making workshops and its backstage workings. You discover the process of putting together an opera, you visit the 36,000 sqm of buildings, but above all, you get to see what aoes on behind the scenes.

As a music lover, you are sure to have heard of Le Fil (= The thread).

It's the concert hall dedicated to modern music. in the Plaine-Achille district. But that's not all. As you are also observant, you will be aware that Saint-Étienne has not contented itself with turning this building into just a concert hall. Bingo, Le Fil is not just a hall that seats 1,500 and puts on 90 events every year, with superb acoustics and a bar-club with a brand new terrace, but it also has three rehearsal and recording studios. A unique, smart place to listen to and make music. Obviously, Sainté has paid great attention to the packaging. Every aspect of the architecture is a tribute to Saint-Étienne design: the metallic exterior, the looms, and the front of the bar that looks like a red ribbon. Come on, show a bit of imagination!

In case you didn't know, it was at École Supérieure d'Art Dramatique de La Comédie de Saint-Étienne that Vincent Dedienne and Sami Bouajila studied drama.

This institution has been creating shows and training actors for over 70 years. Like an ant hill, La Comédie is perpetually buzzing. Here there's everything anyone could need to put on a show: from the scenery workshop to the costume workshop, and including the performers, there's every trade you can think of, all working together in perfect synergy.

With 8,000 sqm of space, including two large auditoriums, a rehearsal room, two studios for the students, a bar that serves snacks and platters on performance evenings, La Comédie is really much more than just a theatre, it's a hive of activity.

La Comète: a space for artistic practice and experimentation.

La Comète, Saint-Étienne's young cultural venue situated on the site of the old Comédie, has 5,000 sqm of spaces dedicated to artistic exploration, which offer a host of advantages. Since 2021, La Comète, an incubator for live performance and creative centre open to all has been constantly on the move. 5 tenants share the space (we call them the Cometians) and, as in any house share, there are plenty of other people coming and going and mingling. Whether it's to take part in a theatre discovery workshop, to have a music lesson, to rehearse in one of the studios, or to see any of the shows that are on throughout the year... there's a unique artistic experience to be had at La Comète, whatever your age!

Want to have a go at acting or dance? Can you imagine it, an entire district of the city dedicated to great ideas and innovation? Well, that's exactly what La Manufacture is.

Here in the aisles of the **old Manufacture**, come and fill up on creativity. Artists, the media, students, startuppers... they're all cheerfully working side by side and sharing their curiosity. And with a site covering 20 hectares, there's plenty of room for everyone. Especially since the **Centre des Savoirs** pour l'Innovation, a centre for knowledge and innovation where academics and companies can share ideas and knowledge, opened. And as if that weren't enough, this eco-neighbourhood has decided to boost the whole city's economy by hosting the FabLab, or more accurately: the **OpenFactory**. It's a workshop, but what you call version 2.0, more modern and unconventional. It's a place for swapping ideas, where you use digital manufacturing equipment to innovate, create and prototype.

But, we hear you thinking, what exactly can you do with a digital milling machine or a laser cutting machine? Well, come and find out for yourself, because that's our motto: **Do It Yourself**!



Perhaps you've heard of PIC (Post Industrial Crafts)? It's one of the latest startups to set up in the Creative District. In his workshop and shop at the Cité du design, Guillaume Crédoz creates chairs, lamps and benches that are as beautiful as they are ecological. 3D printed furniture made from recycled headlights, now there's an idea!

Enchanted Châteaucreux! When you arrive in Saint-Étienne by train, this is the first neighbourhood you see.

It's beautiful because it's proof that the neighbourhood has completely reinvented itself. As soon as you come out onto the station forecourt, you need to open your eyes wide. Design stools, blue horse sculptures, a multi-coloured tree... it is home to loads of design projects. The new Châteaucreux is as much about business as it is about contemporary architecture. On the Îlot Grüner, the Cité administrative will blow you over with its lemon yellow façades. Three huge, staggered porches enable you to admire the building from every angle. Just next door, the social security offices have seen red and have dressed themselves in cassettes of aluminium. The Tour Tésé is the business district's latest tower block. Built of glass, steel and wood, discreetly concealed in its façade there are over 1000 sqm of solar panels. Amazingly, it produces more energy than it uses. With all these structures, you could almost forget that this is also a neighbourhood where people live. You might be surprised to learn that the built space here includes as much housing as it does office space! All alight, vou've arrived!



Does Ella & Pitr mean anuthing to you? We hope so... Châteaucreux has inspired our talented duo of local artists! Two giants have taken up residence at no. 9 rue Cuanot, on a wall in the Hotel Terminus du Forez carpark. The 10-metre hiah work entitled "La fête et la défaite" (Celebration and Defeat) brings a touch of humour and madness to the business district, just how we like it. Plus, it appeals to our curiosity and creativity. If you stand in front of the mural, then take a step back, you can start imagining why one of the characters seems so desperate while the other is completely elated. So what's your verdict?



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This is the story of a neighbourhood that is in the process of reinventing itself.

Crêt de Roc might have a strange name, but what it also has in abundance is ideas. Perched up there on its hill, the neighbourhood has undergone a genuine eco-sustainable transformation, but without looking down on anybody – guite the contrary. Sustainable housing, social ties, a youth hostel, alternative modes of consumption, respect for biodiversity... Its famous steps now attract artists, entrepreneurs and associations. In fact it's thanks to them that this is a place on the move: "Rues du Développement Durable" (Sustainable Development Streets) for example, is an association strongly committed to the economy, which organises "thinkshops" with local residents, puts life back into empty premises and even offers solidarity offices. There's also the brand new Square de la Cartonnerie, which was inaugurated in December 2023. It's a place dedicated to fun, sports and events that has kept its street-art identity, and that's something we just love! And what can you say about the initiatives of the Centre International de Séjour Clairvivre-Wogenscky, the young people's hostel that sits up at the top of the hill and whose architecture can't help but remind you of a certain Le Corbusier... Hurry up and visit, the ideas just keep coming.



At Crêt de Roc, we all like sharing and all things collective, and Maison Rouge won't say anything different! On the ground floor of this youth hostel, there are different shared facilities: a kitchen where everuone can swap their favourite recipes, a lounge, a library... Basically, it's just like home, except that there are people speaking all kinds of languages and fun themed eveninas organised with locals and tourists... We told you, didn't we, being from Saint-Étienne involves a certain state of mind!

Can you imagine, over half a century without any real beer? Impossible.

And yet it's what happened in Saint-Étienne, after the Mosser brewery closed down in the 60s. Fortunately, Benjamin and Pierre-Luc, two mates with a passion for beer-making created the Brasserie Stéphanoise on the very same site. Phew, no more dry throats in Saint-Étienne then. So what is their secret recipe? Carefully selected organic malts and hops. Beers with marked flavours, but always balanced, like the La Manu, their lager, which, after an initial bitterness, leaves delicate fruity aromas on the palate... We bet your mouth is watering already. So you're invited as of now to come and try them for yourself. They're open on Friday and Saturday afternoons. And are you interested in a day's brewing? You can do a course in their brewhouse - there's malting and grinding and brewing aplenty.

#22 LA PÉPINIÈRE-RÉPUBLIQUE

In Sainté, we provide a fertile breeding ground for young creatives. The "seedlings" in the nursery (pépinière) are young entrepreneurs from the creative trades, arts and crafts, publishing and e-commerce. So go and see this showroom in Rue de la République for yourself. You can admire their creations and meet the entrepreneurs.



At La Serre at the old École des Beaux-Arts, the City of Sainté offers a programme of contemporary art while also supporting the careers of emerging artists. With 6 exhibitions each year, it is open to all disciplines (painting, drawing, sculpture, installation, photography, design, digital art, etc.).

#23 THE CABANE DU DESIGN

The Cabane du design is a great place to share some fun time with your children. Situated just next door to its big sister, the Cité du design, this site offers 4 workshops (some supervised, some not) to learn the job of designer: creating testing, doing, undoing, redoing, setting challenges. There's plenty of fun stuff to stimulate young minds!





HALLES MAZERAT-BILTOKI

Did you know? Built in 1872 by Louis Mazerat (to whom we also owe the bandstand on Place Jean Jaurès), the Halles, or food hall, is now run by the Biltoki company. More than just a simple indoor market, it has become a focal point of Saint-Étienne social life where shopkeepers, restaurateurs and conviviality take pride of place. Just the kind of effervescence we like!



#24 PLANÉTARIUM

What's that strange dome over there? Located on the former Manufrance site since 1993, the Planétarium shares all the little secrets of Space. The stars dance, the planets spin, the comets whizz over our heads... Science as an interstellar show!



#26 MAISON HATIER

In 1931, with the help of his personal fortune, a Saint-Étienne pharmacist called André Hatier decided to build a private mansion in the Art Déco style in Rue de la Richelandière! The Villa was requisitioned during the German occupation, and then after the war it had 5 different owners including chef Pierre Gagnaire (who gained his 3rd Michelin star within these walls!). Today the Maison Hatier is a hybrid place, dedicated to co-working and events. Special mentions for the yoga-brunch, the suspended gardens and the 100% upcycled furniture. The Villa just keeps on reinventing itself and we just love that!





At L'Étrat, you might be lucky enough to meet one of the green angels of Saint-Étienne football club coming out of the official training centre. So get your jersey on, buckle up and get going!

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Too far away, no time? No worries, the solution is just a few minutes from Saint-Étienne, on the Firminy-Vert site. Cultural Centre, Housing Unit, church, municipal stadium... it's a whole mini-town made by Le Corbusier himself! If the wonders of concrete leave you cold, no need to panic. The Ondaine and the area to the west of Saint-Étienne are full of special features that give them their own strong character. And at Le Chambon-Feugerolles, there's even a water uses interpretation centre which will tell everything you ever wanted to know about the water. Around Roche-la-Molière, they don't hesitate to express themselves on the façades of the town's buildings. Every year, the town hosts a Street Art festival. As for the region's castles, they are open to the public. Such as the Château des Bruneaux in Firminy with its famous ecomuseum or the Château de Roche-la-Molière and its exhibitions on the local mining heritage. And to finish on a sweet note, we recommend you try a honey sweet from the Miellerie des Gorges de la Loire – they're to die for.

A town within a town, now there's a good idea.

That was the idea of **Le Corbusier**, the visionary architect who needs no introduction. A stone's throw from Saint-Étienne. the Firminy-Vert site delights both connoisseurs and the curious: a multi-coloured Housing Unit, a rather odd, cone-shaped church, a concave Cultural Centre listed by UNESCO, a stadium in the form of an amphitheatre and a swimming pool (designed by André Wogenscky, a disciple of the architect). You wanted Le Corbusier? Well, here you have it, lots of it. It's great to look at and on top of that, there are some cracking anecdotes. Did you know that this site was his second largest complex in the world? And that the windows of the Maison de la Culture were musical windows? And guess which constellation appears in the concrete of Saint-Pierre's church? Anyway, the best thing is to go there, see for yourself and get a little lesson in creativity.

Who knows exactly why... But in Saint-Cham', you can also find some impressive architectural symbols. You can pop in and visit the old Hôtel-Dieu, the churches of Saint-Pierre, Saint-Ennemond and Notre Dame or the City Hall and its inner courtyard overlooking Nelson Mandela park. The town dear to Antoine Pinay and Alain Prost is constantly changing. Be warned, Saint-Chamond, they live life to the full and we have an inkling there's plenty more to come...

Thanks to the region's industrial past, local graffiti artists and co. have plenty of scope to express themselves. When it's not an abandoned factory providing them with a canvas, it's a local festival, the SAFIR* in Roche-la-Molière.. Sometimes, the city actually provides the wall. The M.U.R. Saint-Étienne is a giant art wall installed right in the street (Rue du Frère Maras, to be precise), which invites a different quest artist to fill the space every month. That's how we are in Saint-Étienne, we like big art. Very big even. Ella & **Pitr**, does that ring a bell? Their giant works, often ephemeral and anamorphic, can only be admired if you stand well back. You see, more locals inviting you to change your point of view...

In the Loire, you could say we've case-hardened our character. To see what we mean, just come to the Gier valley and the foothills of the Jarez.

The first stop will be La Mourine smithy museum in Saint-Martin-la-Plaine. Here they forged a history that burned as bright as the blacksmith's brazier. Between air, water, coal and iron, this interpretation centre will set you alight. A visit off the beaten track, in a place that is a sheer concentrate of local history and ancestral know-how. If you push on a little further, you might be surprised by your next encounter. In Saint-Martin-la-Plaine, we also have gorillas! Amazing as that may seem, this is actually a world-renowned conservation centre for the great apes. At the zoo founded in 1972 by Pierre and Eliane Thivillon, the animals are treated divinely. Go and have a look and say hello to the chimpanzees, ring-tailed lemurs, snow leopards and other animals. The region is also a haven of peace and tranquillity, with endless possibilities for stretching your legs a bit. There's no need to go far! Over in the villages of Dargoire or Tartaras for example, where the footpaths will take to you to discover the Rocher Percé or the Saint-Joseph hills.

We are a long way from monastic austerity, though. Here, they welcome the inquisitive of all kinds, for creative visits with a variety of activities and events. With a series of festivals, exhibitions, games throughout the year, you'll never be bored at the Chartreuse de Sainte-Croix-en-Jarez site. And if your thing is walks and big rocks, we've got just what you need: a great 2-hour walk out to the Roches de Marlin megalithic site. But the Jarez region also has another trick up its sleeve over in La Terrasse-sur-Dorlay. The town is home to one of the most unusual museums in the Loire: the Maison des Tresses et Lacets. This magical place is taking care to preserve the know-how of an entire region that made a huge contribution to fashion right up to the middle of the 20th century with its braiding machines. So tie your laces and set off for the Jarez, a region full of surprises!

Sainte-Croix-en-Jarez is a village with a bit of a cheek, squatting as it does in a 14th century monastery. Two large squares, a church and some underground passages: the scene is set. A no-frills sort of village, kind of lost in Le Pilat, a place where people came for peace and quiet. And yet, no more silence and austerity: "the world turns, but the cross remains" was the motto of the monks before the Revolution and they got it just right. The cross is still here, but the rest has certainly changed. No more silence and austerity. Today it's drinks with the neighbours, kids playing off-ground tag, and visitors are welcome. The Chartreuse site has adapted, as you can see, and especially to accommodate our connected teens: it now offers them an "Interactive Quest" (a fun activity to learn all about this heritage site) they can pursue armed with their tablets in the old monastery. So you know what you have to do now...

So you can really let yourself go at La Jasserie and finish up with a blue tongue thanks to the home-made blueberry tart. Once you've recharged your batteries, the Crêts await you. These are the peaks in the park, Crêt de l'Œillon, Crêt de la Perdrix, Crêt de la Chèvre and Crêt de Botte forming the 4 Fantastic Four of Le Pilat. Have you got the stamina to do them all by hiking the Sentier des Crêts trail? If not, you can move down a notch and enjoy some lovely, gentler family walks at Le Bessat. Whether by "hook or by crêt", we will make sure you have a great time in this little corner of the world, which seems to be suspended in the air, as you get your overview of the region. What if we decided to stonewall doom and gloom? Over in Le Pilat, you'll find some stone (and concrete) walls.

They form dams: the Gouffre d'Enfer, 53 metres high, the Pas du Riot, 31.5 metres high, Le Piney, 45 metres high with a giant painted on the wall. A clash of titans, but above all an invitation to overcome vertigo. From the village of Rochetaillée, dominated by its "decapitated" feudal castle, it's easy to set off on walks to the arched giants. And if your legs want more? Since we're in the Le Pilat Regional Nature Park, all you need is good map, your walking shoes and off you go, out into the open spaces. And the amazing thing is this incredible change of scenery is within just a few minutes of Sainté city centre! If you are less down-to-earth and you would like to learn more about the constellations, just in case you need it for long romantic evenings, we also have what you need. The Luzernod observatory at La Valla-en-Gier organises a dozen evenings a year when you can escape into the stars. And once you are in La Valla, it would be a shame not to pop and see the Saut du Gier, a lovely waterfall just above the village. Just be careful not to get wet!

We will warn you though, once you set off on the 31/2-hour hike just above the orchards on the Jarez hills, there'll be nobody to do it for you. But it's well worth the effort, for the views and your health!

THE ADVENTURE OF THE TRAIN: ALL ABOARD FOR DEPARTURE!

Don't visit, live the past!

That's exactly what L'Aventure du Train proposes: it's an immersive digital trail that transports you - in a wagon, if you please - back to the industrial revolution to meet the pioneers of the railways. You might not know it, but the first railway line in continental Europe was built between Saint-Étienne and Andrézieux in 1827. An amazing innovation at the time, driven by the need to transport the local coal to France's cities more easily (the coal was then transferred onto *rambertes*, large barges that plied the Loire - you can see one at Château de Bouthéon). Such a revolutionary development certainly deserved its own visitor centre. So all aboard, this is where the Adventure of the Train begins.

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Back to 1827. Originally, 44 horses each towed 8 tonnes of coal divided between 4 carts over a 17-kilometre single-lane track, where events called "croisières" (crossings) took place when the convoys came face to face. This system ran like a well-oiled machine until 1844, when steam locomotives replaced the horses. If you can't imagine what that must have been like, L'Aventure du Train immersive visit should fill in the gaps!

The Loire is France's longest river, 1,006 kilometres – that's a lot of banks to build castles on...

Well, of course you can't compare **Bouthéon** with Chambord or Chenonceau: smaller, further south, but also more unusual. In the basement, you can board a **ramberte** (a type of barge created here 300 years ago to haul coal) along with a sailor who will tell you all about river navigation and the Marine de la Loire. And all with no risk of getting wet - the experience is immersive, but digital! Outside, farm animals wander the paths, the gardens grow useful everyday plants and all the lakes in grounds are eco-friendly. Not bad eh, life at the château?

You might be tempted by the "route des babets" in the Haut-Forez or the "route des clochers". Get your walking shoes on and off you go, ready to discover the hidden treasures of Rozier-Côtes-d'Aurec, Aboën, Saint-Nizier-de-Fornas or Saint-Maurice-en-Gourgois. Over near Saint-Bonnet-le-Château, you will have to ask yourself THE question: "Do you shoot or do you point?". Petangue, a sport played only in Provence? No way! You only have to go up to this charming village to see that's not true. As well as boasting one of the region's finest collegiate churches - which has a famous collection of mummies, by the way the Cacamerlots (yes, that's what the inhabitants are called) also have the famous Obut company on their doorstep. 

SAINT-ÉTIENNE IN A WEEK-END...

LET'S BE HONEST, 2 DAYS TO VISIT SAINT-ÉTIENNE, IT'S A BIT SHORT! SO LET US HELP YOU GET A CLEARER PICTURE SO YOU CAN MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR TIME WITH US.

FOR THE 1ST DAY, let's start with one of the essentials **the Musée d'Art et d'Industrie** (p. 16) or **the Musée de la Mine** (p. 18) so that you can get an overview of the history of our fine city of Saint-Étienne.

From the 2 museums, you can easily walk to the **Saint-Jacques neighbourhood**. Cobbled streets, stone or half-timbered houses... this walk will take you along **Rue des Martyrs de Vingré** where there are plenty of places to get a very good lunch.

In the afternoon, in a jiffy (in a tram, if you please) you can be in the **Creative District** where you'll discover the distinctive **Cité du design** and its hanging gardens, its Tour Observatoire, its Fabuleuse Cantine (a special mention here for its organic Burger made with recycled flour). And don't forget to admire the architecture of the **Zénith designed by Sir Norman Foster, and La Comédie** (p. 24 and 26).

Take a minute as you're passing to see what's on at Le Fil or the Opéra - you never know, there might still be some tickets available for tonight (p. 22-23)!



RIWAN, member of the Saint-Étienne City Crunch team shares his favourites:

/ Places to eat fresh, local food?

"One that I particularly like is La Fleur au Fusil in rue Camille Colard! Chimère, Le Café du Vieux Saint-Étienne, Grabuge and Pampille are cool places where you can get great food.

/ A shop for designer items?

The Saint-Étienne Hors Cadre shop ;) Honestly, that's what I'd put!

DAY 2

Next day head up **the Colline des Pères** hill for one of the best views over the city and its hills. As you come back down, you can have fun looking for the paintings of **street artists Ella & Pitr**. Next stop **the Mazerat food hall** (p. 33) or **the restaurants on cours Victor Hugo**.

Before you take the train home, we recommend a detour to **the WEISS workshop**, where you can make your own tablet of chocolate and discover the secrets of how this local chocolate is made, right down to the packaging (p. 30).

We told you 2 days was short!



/ A souvenir to take home?

A t-shirt from Trincamp for example, a bottle of coal-black verbena liqueur or a six-pack from the Brasserie Stéphanoise.

/ An unusual activity?

Cooking and/or eating your own meal at La Tablée, a community canteen in the Crêt de Roc neighbourhood.

If you've come by train, we recommend renting a Citiz (there's a pickup point just opposite the Tourist Office!).



LE PILAT (p. 48 to 61)

Climb up out of town southwards towards the Le Pilat Regional Nature Park. Winter or summer, you just have to stop off at the Crêt de la Perdrix, the highest point in Le Pilat with its impressive 360° views from Mont Blanc to Diois. This is the starting point for numerous hiking trails, and you can even walk as far as the Chartreuse de Sainte-Croix-en-Jarez. Your day will fly by!

Today we suggest a dip into **Le Corbusier's** work (p. 42 to 45). The great man's largest architectural ensemble in Europe is barely 20 minutes from Saint-Étienne. Don't miss it whatever you do!

In the afternoon, it's time for a dip into deepest nature (p. 46 and 47), in the **natural Loire Gorges**, which count among the top 20 tourist destinations in the world (according to the newspaper Le Monde!). Still unspoilt and relatively little-known, the Gorges offer panoramic views that will take your breath way.

DAY 5

VINEYARDS (p.52 and 53)

In Tartaras, while they were digging away at the ground to get the coal out, the local people even ended up finding some Gallo-Roman sarcophagi (and they very nearly struck oil). So if you fancy combining some local heritage with a walk through the vineyards, you're in the right place with the Déplaude family, who have taken a gamble on reviving a forgotten vineyard. And of course, there'll be no avoiding a wine tasting!

DAY 6

RELAXATION AND PLEASURE (p.64 and 69)

For your last day, a well-earned rest: so how about a quiet, pleasant outing?

Start with a stroll through **the garden village of Chambœuf**, where June reveals all the splendour of the roses, with their sweet fragrance wafting through the streets. Or you might opt for a peaceful walk round the rose gardens at the **Roseraie de Saint-Galmier**.

When lunchtime comes around, you are sure to find a nice little restaurant to give your taste buds a treat, and then you can continue wandering round the narrow streets of Saint-Galmier looking for original finds in the craft shops. And then if you're are peckish in the afternoon, there's nothing better than to give in and slip into one of the irresistible pastry shops.

Don't forget to fill up your water bottle at the **Badoit kiosk** to quench your thirst along the way. Finally, you can round the day off with a visit to **Château de Bouthéon**, whose lush park is home to a multitude of animals, or maybe you'd prefer L'Aventure du Train.
